The 2010 GPSC events are winding down to a short list consisting of the Race Awards November 5, Dry Dock the 19<sup>th</sup>, Annual Meeting December 3<sup>rd</sup> and wrapping up the year is the Christmas party December 5<sup>th</sup>. If you do not have leftover voter fatigue, be sure to come to the Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting is one of the most widely attended gatherings of the year where club business is discussed, personal connections are renewed, delicious hors d'oeuvres served and incoming officers are elected. ### GPSC HALLOWEEN PARTY

If you missed the Halloween Party – you missed a spooktacular time! Nancy McPherson and Andrea Solak did a great job putting together a frighteningly good party.



Racing participation was up this year slightly.

David Spiers, the Chief Handicapper, is doing a great job and exploring lots of new ideas and improvements to the handicapping process. He announced some rule changes: luff versus leech limitation will be reduced from 10% to 5%, the lower limit on SP girth penalty has been deleted, and roller credits will be only based on luff length without any consideration of sail area.

The regatta schedule was presented for 2011 with the GPSC regatta scheduled July 9th.

The multi-sail plan was experimented with this year and has a number of supporters and detractors. It appears that there will be more exploration next year before the DRYA reaches a consensus about using this approach to racing whereby boats can decide to race with a symmetrical spinnaker, an asymmetrical spinnaker, or jib and main only with handicap credits for using the asymmetrical spinnaker or JAM sails only. This system has fostered a new 3 rating approach that the DRYA will be instituting next year. In other words, each registered boat will receive three ratings: one for symmetrical spinnaker racing, one for asymmetrical spinnaker racing, and one for jib and main racing. Should be interesting.

The DRYA website is being worked on and they are looking for ideas on how to improve it. They are also planning to solicit sponsors for certain pages on the site to help defray expenses.

A new series of sailing seminars will be forthcoming. A discussion is brewing about whether the IRC rating system should be replaced by the ORR system, which is the one used by the Chicago Yacht Club for the Chicago-Mackinac Regatta. The ORR is administered very similarly to the IRC, although it is not quite as expensive. If you have an opinion one way or the other, please share it with the DRYA on their blog.

The DRYA Annual Meeting will be held on November 4th at BYC (7:30PM). And the DRYA Awards Banquet will be held on November 12th at GPYC.

Challenges to boat ratings must be turned in by December 1 using the Request for Review Form available on the DRYA website. However, the Handicap Review Board has decided to review many of the top finishing boats themselves, without waiting for other racers to lodge protests about their competitors ratings. Some of the GPSC boats that are due to be reviewed this winter are Spectre, Freedom, Avatar, and Tresor. It was suggested that they should also review some of the lowest finishers

as well to see if they should have their ratings raised. Dave Spiers has sec/mile data on virtually all the boats that raced this year for analytical purposes.

It looks like the PHRF 1, 2, and Cruising PRF classes may be combined next year to enable closer class splits and better racing for all, with an anticipated 3 or 4 PHRF classes as a result.

Finally, there was a Save Sailing meeting at NSSC recently and there will be a follow up meeting at Northstar on November 15 and anyone interested in promoting sailing in SE Michigan is invited to participate at 7PM.

### **The DRYA Winter Seminars**

The Winter Seminars will continue this year with a persistent effort to explore new topics and bring fresh approaches to old ones. These will start on January 5 and continue for a total of 12 consecutive Wednesday evenings from 7-9 p.m. at various yacht clubs of the DRYA. The first seminar will be at the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club and there will be four speakers relating their unique sailing experiences: Jim Hiller, whose custom 32 foot sloop boat raced the fabled Fastnet and survived, Peggy Walsh-Sarnecki from the Free Press who has written regularly about Michigan sailing, Fred Kreger who was recently honored for his 100<sup>th</sup> Mackinac race (but has never owned a big boat!), and Jim Rapelje who completed his first Trans-Atlantic crossing in the Atlantic Rally for Cruises on a 44 foot catamaran.

The remaining seminar locations have not been finalized, but the January topic schedule follows. Note that many of the topics apply to cruisers as well as racers. Please check the DRYA website (DRYA.ORG) in another month for the final schedule and also before each event to confirm that there are no last minute changes (especially due to the weather). ## Com. Dennis Cotter's 1<sup>st</sup> Place Frostbite Chili Recipe

Ingredients:

- 3 lbs stew beef, cut small, about ½ inch
- 3 lbs tomatoes, cut small
- 2 red bell peppers, cored, seeded and cut small
- 1 golden bell pepper, cored, seeded and cut small
- 1 large white onion, cut small
- 4 small hot red habanero peppers (they were about the size of a golf ball, dark red in color) cored, seeded and cut very small.
- (Tip: keep hands away from eyes after cutting up these peppers.)
- 2 beef bouillon cubes
- 2 teaspoons garlic salt
- 2 cans chili beans in chili gravy
- 1 small can of tomato paste

Combine all ingredients in a good sized stock pot and cook over low heat all day (6 hours). I prepared this a couple of days in advance, then let it cool and refrigerated it until the day of the event. That morning I transferred it to the crock pot and warmed it for a few hours. It seemed to become a little less spicy with the aging.

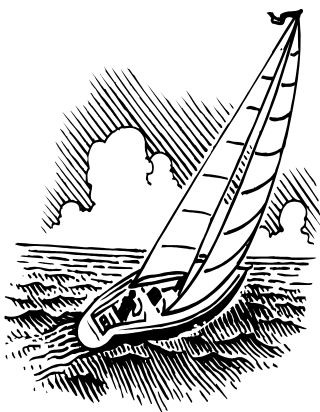
